










Ideas to inspire and support creative writing

 YAKIT Kids	<p>Yakit Kids (free) Give any character a personality that can come to life by making it talk: – Create characters from your class toys, from pupils’ artwork, from an avatar (cartoon picture) or picture found online.</p>
 Epic Citadel	<p>Epic Citadel (free) Explore an empty medieval style town to use as a story setting. Take a screen shot of buildings to generate setting vocabulary. Use screen shots as background images to add to your characters created in other apps.</p>
 Visual Poet	<p>Visual Poet (free) Create short simple poetry using pictures as inspiration.</p>
 Adobe Voice	<p>Adobe Voice (free –free account set up required) Tell a story, share a poem or give an explanation. Add pictures from the iPad or camera, record your narration for each picture. Adobe voice will turn it into a simple and effective movie.</p>
 iDinosaurAR	<p>Augmented Reality BOOKS (free app, but physical book required) iDinosaur is a free app, when you scan pages of the book (about £6 on Amazon at the moment) the dinosaurs come to life.</p>
 Book Creator	<p>Book Creator Create your own book, including text, pictures, video, sound clips. Share digitally with parents or print out a copy.</p>
 ComicBook!	<p>Comic Book (free) Create your own comic style page.</p>
 WeeMee	<p>WeeMee (free) Create your own avatar characters for stories. Use these in other apps, or just to inspire a character description.</p>
 CreatureS	<p>123d Creature Show (free) Create your own mythical characters for stories. Use these in other apps, or just to inspire a character description.</p>
